RENEW...REUSE...RESPECT...REDUCE...REPACKAGE - USE IT UP...WEAR IT OUT...MAKE IT DO...OR DO WITHOUT!

To "succeed" at recycling, it needs to become a "second nature" activity or a "way of life."

- ✓ Save large cotton balls that come in medicine containers and use them to remove nail polish...great because of their large size.
- ✓ Use lids from plastic containers as mini cutting boards for fruit, etc.; use as small plates.
- ✓ Use lids from plastic containers to cut out stencils for coloring projects for kids.
- ✓ Be conscious of paper towel use; use old rags when possible.
- ✓ Use cloth napkins when appropriate.
- ✓ Use rags instead of paper towels ... compost leaves & yard waste ... use a rain barrel to water plants ... repurpose bottles & containers.
- ✓ Unplug your toaster oven, blender, coffee pot, and phone chargers when not in use; it not only lowers your energy bill but also reduces your carbon footprint. Try using the same surge protector so you can cut power to all by removing one plug.
- ✓ Instead of tossing that last teaspoon or jam or mustard, make a dressing right in the jar. Add about a tablespoon of vinegar or lemon juice and a couple of teaspoons of olive oil. Seal & shake; add to your salad.
- ✓ Bring totes & mesh produce bags to the store (keep in your car in between trips).
- ✓ Use reusable mesh K-Cups for coffee instead of disposable pods.
- ✓ Skip cutlery when you order takeout; skip the condiments as well.
- ✓ Refill hand soap & detergent dispensers from bulk containers rather than buying new dispensers.

More than 75% of U.S. waste is recyclable...but we recycle only about 30% of it!!!!

Statewide Ban on Curbside Mattress Collection

As of November 1, 2022, mattresses, box springs, and textiles are no longer allowed in the trash. New state rules require mattresses and textiles be kept out of the waste stream so that they can be recycled or donated for reuse. These items will no longer qualify for bulk item curbside collection.

Textile Recycling (PTO Bins at Middle, Lincoln, Peaslee, Proctor, Zeh Schools, ARHS

Recycle your textiles using the Bay State Textiles collection bins permanently placed at all the Northborough public schools. This program is not only saving the environment, but it is also raising funds for the school PTOs (parent teacher organizations). The individual school PTOs benefit from the donations and receive monthly donations based on the weight of collections. You now have a place for those single socks and stuffed animals! Items must be clean and dry and placed in plastic bags. Items are reused, repurposed, and recycled.

The textile bins provide a means for textiles to be disposed and supports the November 1 state ban on disposal of textiles and efforts to reduce disposal statewide by 30% over the next decade.
